Congratulations to the entire Council for all the work done in completing 500 Knight Hands projects. It is a rewarding and humbling experience to be part of a group of men who feel compelled to help those in need. To commemorate this accomplishment, Jeff Miller has penned the following story for your enjoyment.



Allen Reitmeier was chatting with one of his Meals on Wheels recipients in Duncanville a few months ago when the gentleman lamented his fence being in need of repair for months, work that would cost more than he could afford.



Before long, Reitmeier and three of his brothers in the Knights of Columbus council at Holy Spirit parish in Duncanville - Mario Luna, Hector Rubio and Jesse Radillo – had the work done at no cost. And that was the 500th project benefitting the southwest Dallas County community and other parts of the diocese since Reitmeier, who retired from the home construction business in 1999, initiated the service program through his council in May 2010. "This idea's always been in me, to help people in the community," said Reitmeier, a Minnesota native who came to Texas and Holy Spirit with wife Linda in 1983. "Particularly with home repair, home maintenance. Because that's what I did: I was a home builder. I thought there would be a need. I thought we could give back to the community. It's been with me for years and years, starting in 2000. "It took me 10 years to get it going." And going it has. Reitmeier relates the following from the extensive records that he's kept over the years: the 500 projects have

required more than 7,000 total man hours donated by more than 100 members of Holy Spirit's KC council. Some jobs are completed in a matter of hours. Some require weeks or even months. Knight Hands became an official arm of Council 8157 when Chris Edwards served as the council's Grand Knight. "Allen has always been, from the day I met him, one of these guys who wants to help people," Edwards said. And did Edwards ever envision Knight Hands completing 500 projects? "No, but knowing Allen, the sky's the limit." It's one thing to have the will, it's another to have the way. Knight Hands volunteers bring a variety of skills to each job, whether it's repairing plumbing, trimming trees or building a ramp for someone newly confined to a wheelchair. David Dybala has participated in more than 100 projects, among a few who have responded to Reitmeier's invitations that frequently. "We do it because God's given us the skills and abilities, and what he has given us is to be shared," said Dybala, a retired engineer. "There's no job too small or too big."



The first project was completing some home repairs that parishioners Judy and James Smith had started on their home but were interrupted by James' hip replacement. "That hip threw a wrench into everything," James said. Reitmeier – joined by Ed O'Brien, his late wife Betty, and two decreased Knights (Dick Bates and David Briggs) – arrived to do painting and some minor home repair. Minor to everyone except the Smiths. Gabrielle Hardin, 90 years old and widowed since 2003, is among those who've been helped by Knight Hands on multiple occasions during the past 14 years. "It's just amazing what they have done," Hardin said. "It's such a good feeling to know they're there for me."

Since Jeff wrote this story Knight Hands have completed a number of additional projects; among those are: loaned three wheelchairs to needy persons; installed dishwasher and garbage disposal for Cynthia Poole; replaced the power steering pump and alternator for Ida Medrano; made arrangement to pick up Rita Collier for Mass on Saturday nights; replaced ruptured radiator reservoir; trimmed tree on and around Jose Hernandez's home; installed two smoke detectors; replaced rotted window trim around windows for Elvira Ortiz; cut down trees and cut up fallen trees for Herene Carter; repaired the ceiling for Endelia Serna; built and install a new tabernacle for Fr. Uche. Changed out two dishwashers; replaced ceiling in bathroom for Lovis Miller. We are now up 516 completed projects

# **Baseball ends on a high note**

The baseball season came to an end on a high note. During the 2 tournaments on the weekend of Oct. 19th and 20<sup>th</sup>, 56 games were played and the Knights of Columbus were serving concession food and drinks for every one of them. The little league end of the year tournament was played on fields #1 and field #2 – they played 13 games on Saturday and 10 on Sunday. The second tournament was a "stamp out cancer" benefit tournament, organized by Rosemary Villereal - they played 18 games on Saturday and 15 games on Sunday on Fields #3, 4, and 5 Most of the time there was a line at the concession stand. We had 6 Knights working on the opening shifts, 7-8 Knights on the middle shift and 2-4 on the closing shifts. The most inspiring comment (and there were a number of them) was "man, this is fun". Well, it may have been fun, but it was hard work as orders for hamburgers and hot dogs and nachos were often heard in the concession stand the entire weekend. For example, John Espree, Russell Leroy, Mario Luna, and Peter Perta cooked 326 hamburger patties those two days. We also served 320 hot dogs along with 108 Earl Campbell Hot Links. There were approximately 150 nachos served as well. We also cooked about 180 servings of French fries. Plus all the other foods we serve, like chicken nuggets, chicken patties, frito pies, various flavors of chips and candies and pickles and so on. For sure we can't forget all the snow cones that were served those two days. And lastly, we pretty much sold out all the drink we had on hand. We didn't run out but at closing time on Sunday we had some bottles of water left, a few diet drinks and 6 Gatorades total - that's it. This whole thing started on Friday night when the "stamp out cancer" group held a home run derby – it was for the kids as well as the moms. Ray Rivera was kind enough to join me at the concession stand and we were extremely busy.



But the real rush was Saturday morning about 9:30 or so when everyone seems to be hungry at the same time. Keith and Mary Archer were manning the counter taking orders, John Espree was working feverishly trying to keep up with hamburger orders, Barry Barksdale was doing the cooking (assembling the cheeseburgers, hot dogs, Earl Campbells, making nachos), while Frank Salazar was manning the fryers - you know, French fries, chicken nuggets and chicken patties. Same deal the second shift with different Knights. Moises Martinez got baptized on frying stuff, Jesse Zuniga and Robert Tovar manned the counter, Steve Zehnder, along with Juan Gomez and Damien Gomez assembled the orders. Luckily Russell LeRoy just came out without being asked and grilled hamburgers the whole time. Robert Tovar's wife, Vicki, also helped extensively by making snow cones - I'm thinking at least 75 of them. Russell LeRoy stayed for the final shift as well where Larry Balagna and Dr. Nieto and I closed out the day. Same kind of busy setting on Sunday.

During the first shift, Trevor Edwards and Paul Ryan manned the counter, Tony Almanza did the frying and Marc Evan and Peter Perta did the assembling of food (Peter also grilled burgers in between orders). When the shift changed at 12:30pm, Tony Almanza stayed because one person couldn't make it and he stayed the entire second shift. Larry Balagna returned a second day because another person was unable to work this shift. Russell Gully, as per usual, manned the counter along with myself, Larry and



Miguel Hernandez did the cooking (and they did a terrific job assembling the burgers, making nachos and so on), Mario Luna did the grilling and Benjamin Hernandez made a bunch of snow cones. Nearly all the games were finished by the end of the second shift but, John Owen and I closed out the day.



As an add-on to this story, we had one more surprise tournament on the  $16^{th}$  and  $17^{th}$  of November in which we served concession food and drinks for 11 games. For sure, now the season is ended and will be until sometime around the end of March. Thanks to all who participated in making the season a success in 2024. See you next season.

#### **Parish Breakfasts**
